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1. INTRODUCTION

1.3. OVERALL ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN ABSTRACT

The achievements of the University on various action-facets are briefly presented below.

- As a result of consolidated and concerted efforts taken by the entire staff of Alagappa University under the visionary direction of the Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University is the first University in the State of Tamil Nadu **to obtain A+ Grade with**

a CGPA of 3.64 by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council in May 2017 in the Third Cycle of assessment.

- Under the UGC (Categorization of Universities for Grant of Graded Autonomy) Regulations 2017 (draft), Alagappa University is eligible to become **Category I University** status as it has been accredited by NAAC with score of 3.50 and above.
- MHRD, New Delhi, has sanctioned Rs.20 Cr. to Alagappa University under RUSA – Phase -1 scheme for the development of Infrastructure. Final UC has submitted.
- **Under RUSA – Phase 2.0 scheme, only TEN Universities in India, including Alagappa University, have been sanctioned for Rs.100 Cr. each for two years.** Out of which, 30% is earmarked for Capital expenditure and 70% for the quality improvement of Teaching and Research. Achievements under RUSA 2.0 scheme are listed in 1.6.
- Under QS 2020 Ranking, Alagappa University is placed with 222 place in QS ASIA Ranking, and **24th place in QS India Ranking**. It obtained **36th position in NIRF 2020** Ranking.
- Besides 50 affiliated colleges, one Self-finance College, viz. **Annai Scholastiga College of Arts and Science, Ramanathapuram**, got affiliation during this academic year.
- Galaxy Research Technologies (GRT), Singapore, established R&D unit under Institution – Industry – Interface Scheme, in the campus of Alagappa University for the development of polymer hollow fibre membranes and modules with high quality but at lower cost for clean water technology.
- 'h' Index of Alagappa University has been enhanced **to 85 during the year 2020-2021**.
- **Pandit Deendayal upadhyay Chair was established** with the financial support of Rs.1.5 Cr. from the UGC, New Delhi. Prof. B.Dharmalingam, Director (Retd.), Alagappa Institute of Skill Development, is appointed as Chair Professor.
- **University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC)** Facilities established on 12.9.2017 in the Science Campus of Alagappa University, Karaikudi, has Rs.25 crore worth of instruments including major equipment like XPS – X-ray Photoelectron Spectroscopy, XRD and TEM.
- Four Senior level Administrative functionaries of Alagappa University, viz. Dr. H. Gurumallesh Prabu, Registrar, **Dr. N. Rajakumar, Deputy Director, Dr. S. Arun, Deputy Controller of Examinations and Mrs. S.P. Geetha, Asst. Registrar**, have been nominated to attend **Higher Education Leadership Development (HELD)** programme sponsored by the UGC under the auspices of **UK-India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI)** with the aim to deliver a leadership development

programme for middle and senior level administrative functionaries in Indian Universities.

- The University has strengthened e-Governance by establishing a separate Directorate of Online programmes to offer 3 UG + 12 PG programmes through online mode. Also, created the Directorate of Management Information System (MIS), R&D Centre for Cyber Security (AU-HRC), Data Management Centre (DMC), NAC Cell and Alagappa University Ranking Cell (AURC) to integrate all administrative segments to attain complete e-Governance.
- **Alagappa University Community Radio (90.8 MHz) was commissioned on 26th January 2021** by Shri. Banwarilal Purohit, the Hon'ble Chancellor and Governor of Tamil Nadu on the momentous occasion of India's 72nd Republic Day.
- **An indigenously developed Alagappa University Online Platform (ALUOP) was launched in April 2020.** ALUOP is embedded with Online Admission, Fee payment, Virtual Teaching, Online examination, Digital Evaluation of answer scripts and Online Ph.D. viva-voce examinations for all the wings towards uninterrupted and effective teaching, learning and evaluation processes during Covid-19 pandemic.
- The University has established a **Digital Education Cell** to adopt and promote the MHRD initiative on Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) and 3400 students of our University have registered for MOOCs programmes through SWAYAM portal.
- Recognizing the extension activities, **Mahatma Gandhi National Council for Rural Education (MGNCRE), New Delhi, has** chosen the University for the award of "One District One Green champion" and an Mentor Institution for Mainstreaming Swachhta Action Plan and Jal Shakthi Abhyan in rural areas through community engagements.
- **IAB Blind Empowerment Champion Silver Zone Award** given the Indian Assosication for the Blind in 2020 towards recognizing exemplary services of the University in promoting inclusive education.

1.4. ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN ACADEMIA

Significant Academic Achievements of the academic entities are touched upon.

i. Faculty - Schools of Learning – Departments / Constituent Colleges / Centres-

The **4 Faculties of Studies** the University split in-turn into **11 Schools of Learning** branching out into **44 Departments, 2 + 1 Constituent Colleges** and **10 Centres** have done exceedingly well on most parameters. The 40 Cells and Clubs dealing with almost

every kind of social activity, student support activities, etc have made the campus a year full of activities.

ii. Entrance Exam for Research Programs

On its own quality initiative and as per the guidelines of the **UGC & TANSICHE** the University conducted Common Entrance Examinations for the first time for all M.Phil Programs during 2009-10 and for Ph.D in 2008-09 itself.

iii. 541 programmes of Studies and Research

The University offers 203 programs, all under **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** in the University Departments and its affiliated colleges. Further, 75 programmes are offered through Distance Mode and 146 programmes through Collaborative mode.

iv. College Development Council (CDC)

The CDC guides the Colleges to become '**Colleges with Potential for Excellence**' by applying to the UGC. Many colleges **have got more UGC fund allocation** under the guidance and support from the CDC for creating laboratory, hostel and class-room infrastructure. Proposals received from the colleges are speedily forwarded to the UGC after fine-tuning the same, where required. The CDC is taking efforts for (i) introduction of curricular reforms and development, (ii) conversion of Syllabi into CBCS format, (iii) enhancing the quality of higher education through '**Academic Audit**' of Colleges, (iv) propagating the project culture amongst the College Administration and Faculty, (v) sourcing Government Funds (vi) Orient the colleges about the new initiatives taken by the UGC and Govt. of India (vii) motivate the colleges to go for NAAC Accreditation and so on.

vi. Affiliated Colleges

45 Arts and Science Colleges, comprising 12 Government Colleges, 5 Aided Colleges, 27 Self-financing Colleges under Private Management, 1 university constituent college under Alagappa University Management are affiliating institutions, offering undergraduate, post-graduate and research programs in Science, Arts and Business Studies. In all 117 programs are offered by the affiliated colleges. The affiliated colleges are becoming quality concerned by deputing teachers for FIP to enable them acquire research degrees. The faculty members are getting recognition as guides for doctoral works and the Institutions getting sumptuous fund allocation from the UGC. Quite a number of them are going for permanent affiliation, additional batches, additional shifts, new programs of studies, etc. there is dynamism in the academic and research pursuits. 20 Colleges went for Accreditation / Re-accreditation. One college is accredited with 'A' grade and others 'B' grade. Further, 14 colleges are eligible to go for accreditation at present.

vii. Evening Colleges

The Six Evening Colleges function under the direct administrative management of Alagappa University. Six evening colleges are situated at Rameswaram, Ramanathapuram, Paramakkudi, Thondi, Thiruppuvanam and Sivaganga. They cater to the rural youth who could not afford day-college studies or not interested in pursuing their studies in the day-colleges. There is great social gain, evidenced by then steep rise in enrolment in the past years in these colleges. The University feels its social responsibility is fulfilled immensely through this mode of opportunity being tailored to the needs of the most common sections of the society.

viii. Choice Based Credit System with Uniform Syllabi

The University Departments and Colleges follow CBCS for long time. As needed by the TANSCHÉ, Skill oriented courses, value-education oriented courses and the like are made part of the curriculum so that the graduates become performing assets.

ix. Distance Education Programs

The Directorate of Distance Education has come of age emerging as the 3rd largest institution offering 75 programs. It is doing yeomen service by taking opportunities for education to the door steps of people, young and old, not only in the nook and corner of the nation, but also overseas. The number of students on the roll has come to **61,035 during the year 2020-2021.**

x. Collaborative Programs

146 programs, need based and skill oriented academic programs are offered in collaboration with some of the private professional institutions who are specialists in the specialization of

Catering and Hotel Management, Fine Arts, Textile Designing, Paramedical Sciences, Computer Design, Nautical and Aeronautical Sciences, Biotechnology, Fine Arts etc. The number of students on the roll has come to **13,873 during the year 2020-2021**.

xii. Pedagogical Enhancement & Synergy

To ensure that learners are effectively taught to enhance their skill, progressive use of ICT in knowledge dissemination is needed and that each department is provided with LCD facility smart class room so that PPT presentation is encouraged. The language lab is another novelty to make learning always hands-on. Synergy in the form of pooling of faculty resources, common syllabi for certain management programs, etc is being encouraged. Virtual laboratory through simulated/animated learning with IT support is practiced.

1.5. ACHIEVEMENTS IN RESEARCH & CONSULTANCY

Research Quality is maintained at high level in the University. Alagappa University is one of the early birds to adopt the **University Grants Commission** (Minimum Standards and Procedures for award of M.Phil and Ph.D. Degree) Regulations 2009. The guidelines were formed on the lines of UGC regulations as well as on the lines of guidelines of Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education TANSCHÉ) in important Aspects such as fixing the eligibility criteria for M.Phil / Ph.D Supervisor-ship, Procedure for admission, Allocation of Research Supervisor to scholars, Course Work, Evaluation and assessment methods. This is further galvanized by the DRC at the time of proposal presentation itself.

Faculty members have established research collaborations with universities and institutions within and outside India. The foreign entities with research collaborations include, **RIKEN, Harima Institute, Japan, Institute for Protein Research (IPR), Osaka University, Japan, KIST, Seoul, South Korea, Queens University, Belfast,**

UK, Korea University, Seoul, South Korea, National Taiwan Ocean University, Keelung, Taiwan, Yonsei University, Korea, Osaka University, Japan, Queens University, Belfast, UK, and so on.

1.5.1 FUNDED PROJECTS

Project culture is well entrenched among the faculty members. There are Department level **FIST/SAP/CDBR** projects, Individual Major Projects, Individual Collaborative Overseas projects and Individual minor projects. Many research works funded by **UGC, DST, DBT, NTRO, NABARD, ICMR, DRDO,** etc. are executed by faculty. Students also have got fellowships under UGC (Research Fellowship in Science for Meritorious Students) **RF-SMS, DBT's** (Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research) **INSPIRE, UGC's (Basic Science Research) (BSR)** in Universities, **UGC (RGF).**

1.5.2. ALAGAPPA UNIVERSITY RESEARCH FUND (AURF)

The Alagappa University has created a corpus in the name of Alagappa University Research Fund (AURF) for the promotion of research by the faculty members and research scholars. The fund has been increased to Rs. 10 Crore from Rs. 7 crore during this academic year. Scholars of the University are provided financial assistance for presenting papers abroad.

The Committee thoroughly analyzed the objectives, operation and the guidelines framed earlier of the AURF and recommended the following schemes for the advancement of research in the frontier areas useful to the stakeholders of Alagappa University:

1. AURF Research Fellowship shall be continued as per the guidelines / norms in force
(*Approx. budget estimate – Rs. 24.00 lakhs*)

2. AURF – Partial support for submission of Ph.D. thesis as per the guidelines / norms in force
(*Approx. budget estimate – Rs. 2.5 lakhs*)

3. AURF Research Patent Grant shall be continued as per the norms in force
(*Approx. budget estimate – Rs. 2.5 lakhs*)

4. AURF – Travel grant for presenting Research paper in International conferences:

- Faculty members and Ph.D. / PDF scholars shall avail the financial support for presenting research papers in events (Conferences/ Seminars/ Workshop, etc.) held abroad organized by Foreign Universities / Research Institutes / Institutions of International repute on Subject Specific conferences only.
- The applicant has to submit the Research Paper abstract, acceptance letter / invitation, Conference / Seminar / Workshop brochure, schedule of event along with his/her request well in advance to the Director, Centre for International Relations
- The Director, Centre for International Relations shall forward this request along with his / her remarks and recommendation, within a week's time to the Registrar for further processing. In case of the The Director, Centre for International Relations is out of station for longtime, exceeding a week's time, suitable alternative arrangement shall be made by the University.
- Faculty member / Scholar (by due rotation) shall avail this financial support once in THREE YEARS.
- Partial (or) full financial support (actual amount) as detailed below shall be got reimbursed towards Registration Fee, Air-fare (Onward and Return – Economy class), per diem (DA \$ 75 per day for business day + one day), Visa fee, Boarding and Lodging, etc.

- Each Faculty shall be given Rs.2.5 lakh to organize International Conference in the frontier research areas of research. The Dean of Faculty should take responsibility in organizing the conference representing all departments come under the Faculty.

Approximate budget estimate : Rs. 20 lakhs

6. AURF – Start-up Research Grant

- The faculty members are eligible to apply for AURF Start-up Grant within Five years from the date of their joining in Alagappa University.
- Minimum of Two research publications after Ph.D. in reputed SCOPUS, SCI, Web of Science or similar in stature Journals
- The proposals received shall be blind reviewed by the External Experts and subsequent presentation before the Department Research Committee shall be done for quality

addition and recommendation.

- The duration of project shall be two years and the value of one-time grant shall be Rs.2,00,000/- each for Science projects (maximum three projects) and Rs.1,00,000/- each for Non-science projects (maximum four projects).

Approximate budget estimate : Rs. 10.00 lakhs

11.4 Research Initiatives

COVID-19 is predominantly considered as an unavoidable pandemic and scientists are very curious about how to provide the best protection to the public before a vaccine can be made available. In this, Alagappa University is taking a lead part through research activities in solving the lethality of SARS-CoV-2 at genome level, via identifying its gene code nature types (S type or L Type) and also identifying its mutating tendency (A, B and C types). These insights are studied extensively from the proteome to the atom levels for analyzing the drug targets of SARS-CoV-2 and its reactions mechanisms.

Through genome analysis, almost 16 drug targets of SARS-CoV-2 is identified and from the Alagappa university, we are working to find the suitable

drug candidates for inhibition of Entry mechanism, Capping Mechanism, and the replication mechanism. For attaining the goal of strong potential candidates for COVID-19 inhibitors, Alagappa University stands top in the computational power based solutions for solving the disease drug targets, and especially in COVID-19, four research papers from high peer reviewed journals have been published and extending those works towards the experimental test and with live viral test.

Alagappa University has already initiated the international research collaboration with Institute of Organic Chemistry and Biochemistry, Prague, Czech Republic, Federal University of Rio de Janeiro State (UNIRIO), Brazil & Prof. Hua Li, Huazhong University of Science and Technology, Wuhan, China and reputed national collaboration with Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), BHU, IIT, Mandi and Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore. Research scholars are available in the work from home aspects and university has provided selective permission with proper safety measures to access the University equipment's for performing the research in COVID-19.

Initiation of regular webinar meetings between the Vice-Chancellor and faculty working on COVID-19, and from the faculties to the research scholars going on regularly to have brain storming sessions on solving the COVID-19 related problems.

- Submitted **Nine Proposals** on COVID-19 to various funding agencies and few more are under preparation.
 - Drug repurposing strategies for the identification of potent drugs against the treatment of COVID-19 (DST-SERB Short-term CRG on COVID-19)
 - Computational Prediction of potent drugs and epitope-based peptide vaccine against SARS-CoV-2 (DST-SERB Short-term CRG on COVID-19)
 - Development of transition state mimics for COVID-19 RDRP enzymereaction mechanism blockers using computational and experimental approaches (DST-SERB Short-term CRG on COVID-19)
 - Development of MTases interruption in RNA binding activity using computational and experimental approaches for the inhibition of COVID-19 (DST-SERB Short-term CRG on COVID-19)
 - Host and viral proteome analysis to understand the mechanism of

rapid spread and low mortality rate of 2019 nCoV2 infections (DST-SERB)

- Risk and role of antihypertensive drugs: ACE inhibitors and AT1R domain associated with COVID-19 (DST-SERB)
 - Drug repurposing approach for the development of novel antiviral nanodrugs against COVID-19 through the in silico and in vitro analyses (DST-SERB)
 - Yogic breathing driven herbal steam inhalation: An immunotherapy against COVID-19 (DST-SATYAM)
 - Re-routing agricultural supply chain measures for the COVID-19 Pandemic (ICSSR)
- Faculty members delivered Several lectures through Webinar where thousands of students from various countries are benefited.
 - Also Supplying Viral Transport Medium to the Deputy Director of Health Services, Sivagangai, Tamil Nadu on regular basis upon request.

11.5 Design and Development of 'Sensor Based Touch-free Sanitizer Dispenser'

A group of students and trainers of Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Career Hub of Alagappa Institute of Skill Development have developed a cost effective **"Sensor Based Touch-free Sanitizer Dispenser"**. By using this, one can get sanitizer without touching the dispenser and at the same time quantity of sanitizers is being controlled by the programmed sensors. Prior to this sensor based device, the same group of students have developed a leg pressed touch-free sanitizer dispenser. Measures have been taken to install these Touch-free Sanitizer Dispensers in the Campuses of the University.

11.6 COVID-19 Prevention and Healthcare Initiatives

Alagappa University **Healthcare Centre** coordinates the COVID-19 containment process and services of the University along with monitoring of campus cleaning. Dr. Aanandhi, Assistant Professor cum Medical Officer of the University has been nominated as Nodal Officer for containment process and services of the University.

Accordingly, Alagappa University has been sanctioned with Rs. 100 Cr. under component 4 (Enhancement of Quality in Teaching and Research to Select State Universities) and Alagappa University is the only university in Tamil Nadu qualified for this status. Out of the sanctioned grant, the First installment grant, Rs.40 crore has been released to Alagappa University with the sharing pattern of 60:40 between the MHRD, New Delhi and Government of Tamil Nadu. Grant of Rs. 100 Crores has been sanctioned to Alagappa University and the first installment of Rs. 40 Crores has been released vide G.O. (MS) No 277 dated 15.11.2018 (GoI share of 60% and GoTN share of 40%) and 1.67 Crores released vide G.O.(Ms) No 43 dated 17.02.2021.

With this special support under RUSA phase 2.0 scheme, Alagappa University has submitted the Detailed Project Report (DPR) stating the details of Construction of Academic, Research and Hostel buildings, Renovation of Buildings, Purchase of Advanced Scientific Equipments, Student Research Support, Socially relevant path-breaking Research, Implementing MHRD and e-Governance initiatives and Skill Development, support for Innovation and Incubation along with Career guidance through Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Career Hub. The Revised Detailed Project Report (DPR) of RUSA 2.0 has been approved by the Finance Committee on 27.8.2020 and by the Syndicate vide Resolution number 4 dated 27.8.2020

Meeting of Board of Governors and Project Monitoring Committee was conducted on 16.05.2019 to monitor the progress of project. Constituted a **Task Force** to review the progress of Theme Based Research Projects.

Work Progress Report

1. Construction of New Buildings:

Under RUSA Phase 2.0 scheme, construction of **new buildings for Rs.14.50 Cr.** viz. New Social Science Block, Alagappa Institute of Educational Sciences, Information Technology Avenue, University Scientific Information Centre (USIC), Students' Hostel for Girls (Skill Development), Indoor Stadium and Establishment of Solar Park have been completed and put into functional.

2. Common Equipment

3.1.6. Travel Support to present Papers in the International Conferences:

With the financial support to the tune of Rs.250 lakhs, 101 faculty members participated and presented their research papers in the International Conferences held in the countries such as USA, Japan, Korea, New York, Dubai, Thailand, Taiwan, Italy, China, France, Greece, South Africa, Singapore and Malaysia.

3.2. MHRD Initiatives

3.2.1. e-Governance Initiatives

Online Programmes

- Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has identified Alagappa University as one of the twenty institutions to offer on-line academic programmes.
- Alagappa University has established a separate Directorate for Online Programmes to offer initially 19 programmes through online mode in collaboration with the partnering Institutions identified by the Participating countries. Alagappa University is also in consultation with MEA to offer on-line programmes exclusively in Tamil literature, Fine Arts and Culture to Tamil Diaspora in the Asian countries like Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Singapore.

Massive Online Open Courses

- The SWAYAM/MOOCs (Digital Education) Cell was formed in the month of November 2017 at Alagappa University, Karaikudi.
- The UGC Credit Framework for online courses through SWAYAM regulation 2016 has been approved in the meeting of the Standing Committee on the Academic Affairs of the University held on 13.11.2017.
- 1123 students selected the MOOCs courses in the SWAYAM Platform and these MOOCs courses were approved in the Standing Committee meeting held on 13.03.2018.
- The installation of SWAYAM Prabha DTHs for 37 Departments under RUSA Phase 2.0 was completed at a cost of Rs. 1.70 Lakhs.
- SWAYAM Prabha DTHs Orientation Programmes for Department Co-ordinators of all the four faculties were organized from 05-03-18 to 09-03-2018.

- During July 2018 session, 2367 students selected the MOOCs courses in the SWAYAM platform in the University.
- Dr. C. Baskaran, SWAYAM Co-ordinator and Dr. N. Johnson, Deputy Co-ordinator of SWAYAM were permitted to attend the UGC Orientation Workshop on MOOCs held at Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad on 31.08.2018.
- A One-day Workshop on Design and Development of MOOCs was organized on 30.10.2018 at Alagappa University.
- Under the RUSA Phase 2.0 revised credit plan for the PG students, they need to select MOOCs courses in their Second and Third semester of their regular programme. Similarly, the UG students also should select the MOOCs courses in the Third and Fourth semesters.
- During Jan 2019 session, a total of 1833 students (the Second semester (PG) and fourth semester (UG)) selected MOOCs in the SWAYAM platform.
- During July 2019 session, totally 1635 enrolled the MOOCs courses by the Students (only third semester) from University Departments in the SWAYAM portal.
- Three Day International workshop E-Content Development for MOOCs for the faculty members to be organized during 11th, 12th and 13th September by Digital Education cell, Alagappa University, the workshop sponsored under RUSA 2.0 scheme,

National Academic Depository (NAD)

Alagappa University has been uploaded three lakh data in National Academic Depository (NAD) portal.

Establishment of Management Information System (MIS)

In order to integrate the University data under one common platform, University has established the Management Information System (MIS) under RUSA phase 1.0.

An exclusive building at a cost of Rs.215 lakhs was constructed for this purpose. Special efforts are taken in this venture to integrate all the administrative segments, viz. Admission, Establishment, Examination, Research and Finance to ensure complete e-governance.

Recently, one Intranet application developed by the faculty and students of Alagappa Institute of Skill Development has been launched on 1st July 2019 for paperless administrative communications.

Automation in Examination Wing

Examination wing has been fully automated. All students can submit the examination application online, pay the examination fee online, print the hall ticket online and view the results online. Answer booklets have been prepared with Barcode and QR code technology. **Digital Evaluation** of answer scripts is introduced for the University Departments and PG valuation of Affiliated Colleges. The same will be extended to all affiliated colleges and Distance Education also for the ensuing examinations.

e-Governance initiatives in Research Wing

- Several initiatives have been taken for the conduct of Entrance Examinations, speedy Publication of results and Issuance of certificates through on-line.
- e-copy of the Ph.D. Thesis and Synopsis are sent to the External Examiners and the reports are also accepted as soft copy. This greatly helps to save the processing time and minimize the paper usage.

Surveillance System

In order to ensure safety and security to the students, **112 CCTV have been installed in the campus** and proposal has been sent to the Government of India under Nirbhaya Fund scheme seeking the financial support of Rs. 81 lakhs to install the additional 68 CCTV cameras in the campus.

Biometric System

Biometric system of attendance has been introduced initially to the outsourcing employees (about 400) and the same will be introduced shortly to the Teaching and Administrative staff of Alagappa University.

3.2. 2. University Society Linkage:

Keeping the tradition of societal involvement, University has been conducting Village Extension Programmes (VEP) every year. All the second year Post Graduate students are rendering their services in the neighbouring villages.

The University has adopted 81 villages (University Departments : 39, Affiliated Colleges : 42) and provided various services such as Health Awareness, Cleaning and painting the water tank and public places, Survey on rural unemployed youth, Life Skill Education Programme and Total Sanitation Campaign – Open Defecation Free (ODF) villages by involving students and faculty.

In first phase, **163 Ph.D scholars**, selected through Research Committee, are being disbursed fellowship @ 25,000 for NET/SLET qualified candidates and INR 20,000 for non NET/SLET with effect from 17th September 2018 during the RUSA phase 2.0 period. This will be continued for two years. **Special drive of Pre-PhD entrance examination was conducted to attract more Ph.D. scholars. The result of eligibility for Ph.D. registration was declared and 100 more fellowships will be disbursed to the meritorious entrance qualifiers.**

As per the directions of MHRD, apportion of Rs. 15 Cr. grant has been done. Rs. 6 Cr. has been allotted for Hard Components (Rs. 2.00 Cr. for the building, Rs. 4 Cr. for Non-recurring expenditure related to establishment of the learning infrastructure) and Rs. 9 Cr. for Soft Components (recurring expenditure for skill training and innovation, incubation support)

In continuation to the Digital Launch of this Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Career Hub by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India on 3rd February 2019, few of the existing short-term skill training programmes, such as, Solar P.V. 4. CITIZEN'S CHARTER

The Citizens including Students, Parents, Management and others are to be bestowed with the following rights, which shall be ensured by the University.

A. Right to Information

On various Courses of Study:- Institutions offering the courses, availability of seats/vacancies, admission procedures, fee particulars, facilities available for the courses etc.

On academic calendar indicating the dates of various academic activities. On Syllabi, Regulations, objectives of different Courses of Study, Job/Career prospects, scope for further study etc.

On course equivalence and eligibility for the purpose of inter-university, inter-state and international mobility for further studies / employment. For transparency in regulations / procedures of all areas of administration with little room for discretionary and discriminatory practices.

II. Right to Access

The University and its Constituent Colleges shall lay down clear and specific norms / procedures for admission to various courses of study and strictly adhere to the specified norms / procedures without any individual discrimination.

Any candidate subject to the fulfillment of the prescribed norms/ procedures, shall have right to admission without any personal discrimination.

Any student shall have right to access to campus facilities such as library, computation facility, hostels, playgrounds etc. without any personal discrimination.

III. Right to response

Any letter requesting for information / clarification/ certificates etc. shall be duly acknowledged and attended to within the prescribed time limit.

Every letter shall be replied to or acknowledged, if it is under consideration, within a maximum time limit of 15 days from the receipt of the same by the University. On urgent / emergency requests, action shall be taken expeditiously.

Request form Marks statement, Provisional Certificates and Degree Certificates shall be responded within a month from the declaration of examination results or the conduct of Convocation as the case may be.

Request for admission norms, vacancy position, syllabi / regulations, eligibility and Migration Certificates, course equivalence certificate etc. shall be responded within a fortnight.

IV. Right to Redressal of Grievance

Any grievance regarding matters pertaining to admission, conduct of course, examination and others incidental to educational administration shall be got redressed within a prescribed time-limit

V. Right to Quality of Service

Right to insist on the quality of education, regularity in the conduct of classes, proper examination system, the quality and relevance of syllabi and proper campus facilities conducive for academic work.

The University / Colleges shall have the duty to provide facilities for ensuring quality and value based education.

The University shall have the duty to monitor and ensure quality of education in its Departments and the Constituent Colleges.

5. EXAMINATION

Due to COVID-19 pandemic, the Examinations for the University Departments, Affiliated Colleges and Distance Education programmes were not conducted during the May – June 2020.

6. CONVOCATION

The Thirty Second Convocation of Alagappa University was held on 1st October 2019. The Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu and Chancellor of Alagappa University Shri Banwarilal Purohit conferred degrees and presented medals to 325 graduates in person which includes 169 Ph.Ds, 1 D.Sc., and 155 Rankholders. A total of 26,808 candidates received their degrees in person and in-absentia.

A Renowned Cardiologist, Devoted medical teacher and Productive clinical researcher, Dr. J.S. Satyanarayana Murthy delivered convocation address.

7. CENTRAL LIBRARY

The University has modernized the learning resources for providing quality education. The University Library system has been modernized and strengthened at a cost of Rs.175 lakhs during 2016-17. The Central Library and four Faculty Libraries have been automated with a new state-of-the-art, web-based Library system with Radio Frequency Identification Device (RFID) interface for security and service. High-end servers, 40 numbers of latest computer terminals, printers, UPS backups, self-checkout kiosks and drop-box for circulation of books, information kiosks, CCTV surveillance, multifunction copiers, ergonomically designed furniture, air-conditioners, audio and video equipment have been added. A modern Seminar Hall with a Server Room, a Property Room, a Help-desk, a status of Goddess Saraswathi have been established. 1002 e-books worth Rs.16.70 lakhs have been added in addition to other conventional reading resources during the year 2017-18.

Besides, Faculty Library in four faculties, viz. Faculties of Arts, Science, Education and Management of the University, have been created for easy access to the students. The Library has emerged as a Knowledge Learning Resource Centre, mainly catering to the information needs of the Faculty, Research Scholars and Students of the University. The Library is open throughout the year from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m excepts Sundays and Government Holidays. Now, the library is housed with nearly one lakh of Reference and Reading books and subscribed with about 150 International and National journals.
